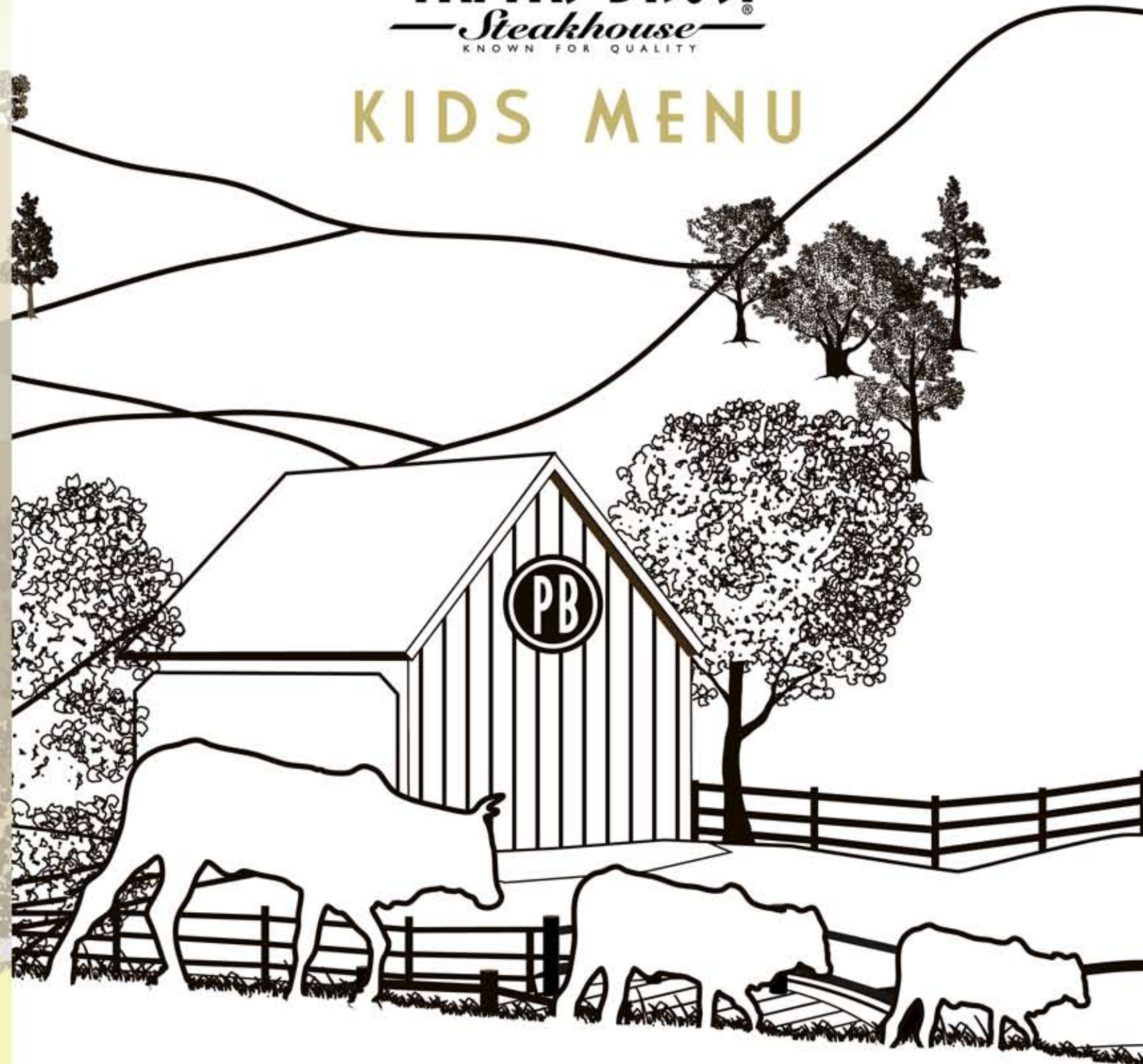

- ★ Cattle are able to see all color, except red.
- ★ Cattle have almost 360-degree panoramic vision.
- ★ Cattle have a keen sense of smell up to 5 miles away.
- ★ They can live up to 25 years.
- ★ The number of rings on the horns = approximate age.
- ★ A cow has 1 stomach with 4 digestive chambers.
- ★ No two cattle have the same pattern or spots.
- ★ Cattle can weigh up to 1,200 pounds.
- ★ An adult male is called a bull.
- ★ An adult female is called a cow.
- ★ The young is called a calf.
- ★ Cattle eat corn, hay, barley, beet pulp, grass and wheat.
- ★ Cows give us milk, leather and meat.
- ★ Milk can be made into other dairy products: butter, cheese, yogurt.
- ★ There are about 950 breeds of cattle in the world.

TIC TAC MOO



The character of 'Uncle Sam' is modeled after Sam Wilson, a meatpacker from Troy, New York. During the War of 1812, the meat he shipped to the government was stamped 'U.S. Beef.' Soldiers began to call this beef Uncle Sam's beef.

SOME CATTLE SPECIES

TEXAS LONGHORN

- Developed in Spain and brought to Mexico in 1493. Driven to Texas in 1690.
- Eats a wider range of grasses and weeds than most other cattle.
- The most spectacularly colored cattle - so varied that no two are alike.
- Produces a very lean beef.
- Possesses a natural immunity to diseases and parasites.



BEEFMASTER

- Developed in Texas in 1930s (Brahman-Hereford-Shorthorn cross).
- Heat, drought and insect resistant.
- Brownish-red is the most common color.
- Developed to thrive in the harsh climate of South Texas.



BRANGUS

- Developed in 1932 in United States (Angus-Brahman cross).
- High performers on pasture and in the feed lot.
- Brangus cattle are black or red with a sleek coat.
- Cows are good mothers.
- Proven resistant to heat and high humidity.



HEREFORD ANGUS

- Imported from England in 1817.
- Many females live and produce calves beyond 15 years of age.
- Hereford cattle are dark red, with a white face and crest.
- Known for their grazing ability.



CHAROLAIS

- Imported from France in 1936.
- Tremendous muscling and conformity.
- Known for ease of calving and cross breeding.
- Long bodied and good milkers.
- The typical Charolais is white in color.
